ID AYU0109) with intake capacity of 60 seats in UG (BAMS) course and 2nd Renewal of permission for 03 PG courses with intake capacity of 12 Seats in the subjects namely (i) Kayachikitsa -04 seats (ii) Dravyaguna Vigyana -04 seats (iii) Panchakarma -04 seats for the academic session 2026-27 under section 28 of NCISM Act, 2020 and relevant regulations thereunder-reg.

Sir/Madam,

- 1) To assess the available facilities of teaching, non-teaching, hospital staff, practical training and other infrastructure facilities at your college namely **Vishnu Ayurveda College, P.O. Government Press, Shoranur-679122, Palakkad Dist., Kerala, (Inst. ID AYU0109)** inspection was conducted on **22.05.2026 and 23.05.2026 on Hybrid mode** as a part of annual visitation by the visitation team of Medical Assessment and Rating Board, NCISM to process the **permission with 60 seats in UG (BAMS) course and 03 PG courses with intake capacity of 12 Seats in the subjects namely (i) Kayachikitsa -04 seats (ii) Dravyaguna Vigyana -04 seats (iii) Panchakarma -04 seats under section 28 of NCISM Act, 2020 for the academic session 2026-27.**
- 2) The visitation report and all other related documents were assessed in terms of enforced regulations namely the "Minimum essential standards, assessment and rating for undergraduate Ayurveda colleges and attached teaching hospitals Regulations, 2024", "Minimum essential standards, assessment and rating for postgraduate Ayurveda colleges and attached teaching hospitals Regulations, 2024" provisions under the NCISM Act, 2020 and relevant Regulations thereunder. **On careful examination of the assessment report, visitor observation and approved punitive policy, it is found that your college is not fulfilling the notified & approved criteria, due to the following shortcoming:**

1. Biometric attendance:-

- a) Out of 43 teaching faculty members, it is submitted that, on verification of AEBAS data from 25.05.2025 to the date of visitation, it has been observed that 04 faculty members are not meeting the minimum required attendance of 50%.

b) Central research laboratory is **not available**.

6. **Mean** of general and essential equipment's/instruments availability is **69.17%**.

- 3) The assessment report was duly placed in the 165th Board meeting of Medical Assessment and Rating Board for Indian System of Medicine (NCISM) convened on 24.07.2026 and Board concluded that the college is fulfilling the notified & requisite criteria for issuance of extended permission as per the Concerned Acts and regulation. Hence, the Board decided to issue **extended permission with condition** in accordance with Regulation 54 (2) of MESAR UG Ayurveda 2024 with intake capacity of 60 seats in UG (BAMS) Course and 2nd Renewal of permission for 03 PG courses with intake capacity of 12 Seats in the subjects namely (i) Kayachikitsa -04 seats (ii) Dravyaguna Vigyana -04 seats (iii) Panchakarma -04 seats under section 28 of NCISM Act, 2020 for the academic year 2026-27 as the college has been permitted consecutively for previous three years after fulfilling the conditions as specified in the concerned Regulations.

"DECISION"

- 4) Therefore, **Extended permission with condition** in accordance with Regulation 54 (2) of MESAR UG Ayurveda 2024 and is hereby granted to Vishnu Ayurveda College, P.O. Government Press, Shoranur-679122, Palakkad Dist., Kerala, (Inst. ID AYU0109) with an intake capacity of 60 seats in UG (BAMS) course and 2nd Renewal of permission for 03 PG courses with intake capacity of 12 Seats in the subjects namely (i) Kayachikitsa -04 seats (ii) Dravyaguna Vigyana -04 seats (iii) Panchakarma -04 seats for the academic session 2026-27, under section 28 of NCISM Act, 2020 subject to the condition that following conditions shall be fulfilled :-

- I. **Minimum 15% of undergraduate seats of the permitted intake capacity with 60 seats** shall be treated as all India quota. The counseling for seats under all India quota shall be conducted by respective counselling authority as designated by Central Government for A.Y. 2026-27 and counseling for the remaining 85% seats or as the case may be, shall be conducted by the concerned Counseling Authority of that State/UT. **The permission of the college**

stands withdrawn if the college fails to comply with the aforesaid direction for all India quota or the students admitted thereunder.

- II. Determination of fee and all other charges in respect of 50% of seats in private Medical Institutions and deemed to be University should be as per the guidelines issued by NCISM vide ref no. BUSS/Fee/ASU/2022-23 dated 16.09.2022. Fees of the remaining 50% of seats are to be fixed as per the guidelines of Fee Fixation/Regulatory Committee (FRC) of respective State/UT/Deemed to be University.
- 5) Admissions made in violation of the above conditions will be treated as invalid and action will be initiated under NCISM Act & Regulations thereunder.
- 6) Further, **as per Sub-section (7) of Section 29 of NCISM Act, 2020**, The Medical Assessment and Rating Board for Indian System of Medicine may conduct evaluation and assessment of any University or medical institution at any time, either directly or through any other expert, having integrity and experience in medical profession, without any prior notice and assess and evaluate the performance, standards and benchmarks of such University or medical institution and if the college is found to be not maintaining the Minimum Essential standards as specified in the concerned Acts & Regulations then **in accordance of Section 28 (1) (f) of NCISM Act, 2020 the issued permission of the college shall deemed to be withdrawn and denial of permission shall be issued by MARBISM for stoppage of admission for that particular academic year or the subsequent year.**
- 7) Discrepancies, if any, may be immediately brought to the notice of Medical Assessment and Rating Board for Indian System of Medicine, NCISM.
- 8) **Compliance of all the requirements of Aadhaar Enabled Biometric Attendance System as mentioned in the Implementation letters vide. Ref. no. 3/2024/MARB/AEBAS & HMS. Dated 09.05.2024 & 06.09.2024 issued by the Board.**
- 9) **The following requirements must be fulfilled and the compliance report must reach the Board by 31st December, 2026 to be considered for the issuance of permission for the academic session 2027-2028:-**
- i) All the requirements under the provisions of the NCISM Act, 2020 and relevant Regulations made thereunder should be fulfilled.
 - ii) All the requirements of Minimum Standard of infrastructure and teaching & training facilities as specified in NCISM (Minimum essential standards, assessment and rating for undergraduate Ayurveda colleges and attached teaching hospitals) Regulations, 2024.
 - iii) All the requirements of the National Commission for Indian System of Medicine (Minimum Standards of Undergraduate Ayurveda Education) Regulations-2022.
 - iv) **The shortcoming mentioned in para no. 2 above, shall be fulfilled within 3 months from the date of issuance of this letter under intimation to MARBISM.**
- 10) The fulfillment of the conditions given above may be made within the time period specified and compliance report should be submitted by the college within the timeline as mentioned above to the President, Medical Assessment and Rating Board for Indian System of Medicine. The Medical Assessment and Rating Board for Indian System of Medicine will verify that the conditions have been fulfilled for considering the permission for the academic session 2027-28.
